With the advancement in radiation and chemotherapy, cancer patients are living longer. Spinal tumors can be very disabling, and mandate a multifaceted management plan, with surgery offering the potential to alleviate pain, return function, and correct alignment. In many cases, spinal tumors involve adjacent structures, whether in the chest, abdomen, pelvis, or paraspinal muscles. This mandates versatility on the surgeon's part and employing various approaches and strategies, adding an extra layer of complexity compared to a traditional spine surgery practice.

I currently see patients at three Froedtert & MCW locations: the Clinical Cancer Center at Froedtert Hospital; the Orthopaedic, Sports and Spine Center in Menomonee Falls; and the Cancer Care Center at Community Memorial Hospital in Menomonee Falls.
